



Professor Zachary Douglas QC

Professor Zachary Douglas QC has a substantial practice before international courts and tribunals as counsel, expert witness and arbitrator, and also frequently appears before the English courts and other common law courts in cases with an international law element. He is a Professor of International Law

at the Graduate Institute of International and Development Studies in Geneva.

Zachary has served as an arbitrator in more than seventy cases under the LCIA, ICC, UNCITRAL, Swiss and ICSID Rules, including as chairman and as sole-arbitrator in half of those cases. He has acted as counsel in some of the most significant investment treaty arbitrations and commercial arbitrations in the world such as *Chevron v Ecuador*. Zachary has also acted as counsel in cases before the English courts and other common law courts in a range of matters relating to public and private international law including state immunity, human rights and humanitarian law, state succession, challenges to arbitral awards, corporate responsibility under international law and money laundering. He has represented individuals and companies in proceedings before the European Court of Human Rights and States before the International Court of Justice. He has also acted in dozens of cases before the Court of Arbitration for Sport, having formerly represented the International Olympic Committee. He is the author of one of the leading treatises on investment treaty arbitration: "The International Law of Investment Claims", published by Cambridge University Press. He is fluent in both Russian and French.
